PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CIVILIAN PERSONNEL REGULATIONS CONCERNING THE ROLE OF THE CONFEDERATION OF NATO RETIRED CIVILIAN STAFF ASSOCIATIONS

- 1. I attach at Annex proposed changes to article 90.3 of the Civilian Personnel Regulations (CPRs) concerning the role of the Confederation of NATO Retired Civilian Staff Associations (CNRCSA).
- 2. The CNRCSA represents the interests of retired NATO staff on matters that affect them directly. The proposed amendments align articles 90.3 and 90.1 of the CPRs related to the Confederation of NATO Civilian Staff Committees by using similar wording.
- 3. The Strategic Commanders and I have endorsed the proposed amendments recommended by the Joint Consultative Board, following consultation with administrations in Agencies and Military Commands, and Staff Representatives.
- 4. The remaining amendments are technical corrections.
- 5. I do not consider discussion on this matter necessary. Accordingly, unless I hear to the contrary **by 17:30 on Monday, 4 November 2019**, I shall consider that the Council has agreed the proposed amendments.
